

## 3 DAY WORKSHOP ON DISASTER MANAGEMENT INAUGURATION - ROAD ACCIDENTS - FIRST AID

The 3-Day Workshop on Disaster Management was held 08-09-2018 to 10-08-2018 at Government Degree College Rayachoty.
